

As a member of this Council, Doreen wore many hats - Councillor in charge of Prospect Place, parks, and spent significant time in charge of roads and streets. We also formed a committee to take operational control of the Doak Historical Property. We were in the process of forming an Athletic Association to enhance sport in the Village and Upper Miramichi region. There will be many great words spoken of Doreen Parker - community leader and a wonderful family person. Doreen was always the person I brought my problems to when it came to community service. She always listened and brought a great perspective. I will miss my friend and the community will miss her. The initiatives she brought to our community will never be forgotten. Until we meet again Doreen, watch over us as we carry on with our work in the Village.







OPEN NIGHT


