Welcome to mid-summer - it is amazing how time flies as we find ourselves preparing for the New Brunswick Day festivities! It was an honour to have our Premier, Susan Holt, and the Minister of Tourism, Heritage and Culture, the Honourable Isabelle Theriault joined us in the park Friday. As most residents know by now, we received the distinction of official municipality for the NB Day celebrations. With that came a grant in the amount of \$30,000 to cover the costs associated with putting on a "Great Show"!

This is a wonderful opportunity to showcase our beautiful Village and the best promoters are the residents themselves. Take the time to tell relatives and friends about what we have to offer and the many activities planned for the August 1st weekend. Doaktown will be celebrating a trifecta of milestones; the Doak Historical Property is 200 years old, our photographic "Train Bridge" hits the century mark, and we have been organizing the Annual Salmon and Fiddlehead Parade for 25 years!

The spotlight will be shining on the Village this year as we receive much needed publicity from the media, brought on by the Premier's award. This is the time to cast a lasting impression on our fellow New Brunswickers and leave no doubt that the village is deserving! As we receive an influx of people from away, make an extra effort to groom your property, help your neighbours, be extra courteous, and get out to the different events to show support. This recognition has gone to the City of Fredericton for several years and I am very grateful this money is going to a small municipality in the heart of the province along the Miramichi River valley! The money and distinction will add to our economic growth, boost tourism, and certainly give local business a much needed "shot in the arm".

Another initiative the Village has been working on, is summer recreation and maximizing the opportunities at Prospect Place. Council and staff have pursued a funding grant to purchase sporting equipment to start a summer recreation program involving activities such as pickleball, basketball, table tennis, and washer toss. We strongly believe that sport and ensuring our youth have group activities is imperative to keeping the community safe and developing leaders for the future. We have a Recreation Director, Rachel Best, hired through the summer student grants, and she is keen to get this underway and is building a program that will last for summers to come. Get active, get involved!

Finally, I always like to clear up questions from the public that seem to come up more often than others. There seems to be a perception that the Village of Doaktown does not support Minor Hockey. That cannot be further from the truth! The manager at Prospect Place pours his soul into ensuring Boiestown/Doaktown Minor Hockey Association (BDMHA) is at the forefront of all planning, scheduling, and accommodation for ice time at the arena. As the major tenant of Prospect Place and the priority over all other activities, BDMHA is the primary beneficiary of this facility. The Village of Doaktown budgets \$246,103.00 to ensure this facility operates. We often open early or run later into spring for regionals and provincials. If there is a failure in the plant and the municipality needs to go beyond our budget, there is never a question. Get it done and keep the youth on the ice! No question, Doaktown supports BDMHA 100% and will continue to do so. I would also like to congratulate Upper Miramichi Regional Community for their contribution to Minor Hockey and receiving acknowledgement from the BDMHA during the presentation to Council. Stay safe, enjoy this beautiful summer and get out to the festivities.

## Snack and a Half Recipe

- 3/4 cup milk (any kind)
- 11/4 boxes Breaktime oatmeal cookies (about 50 cookies if using this brand)
- 1.5 Litres (16 oz) Cool Whip
- 4 Crispy Crunch bars, crushed or any of your favourite chocolate bars
- 1. You will need a 9×13 pan. Pour the milk into a wide mouth bowl, something you can dip in easily.
- 2. Dip the cookies into the milk and then line the bottom of the pan until covered.
- 3. Spread 1/2 of your cool whip over top of the cookies and then sprinkle 1/2 of your crispy crunch bar crumbs over top.
- 4. Repeat these steps once more so that you have 2 layers of cookies and finish with Crispy Crunch bar crumbs on the top. Cover with saran wrap and place in the freezer for at least 4 hours. Remove from the freezer about 10 minutes before serving and enjoy!
- 5. Store in the fridge or freezer but I prefer it kept in the freezer.

# Happy Retirement Barb Long THANK YOU FOR 39 YEARS



For the past 39 years, Barb has dedicated her life to education—guiding, teaching, and helping students find their path. She has been more than just an educator; she's been a mentor, a colleague, and a true friend to many. Her unwavering commitment to student success has always been at the heart of everything she does, always stepping in to support those who need an extra hand.

Barb's journey began after graduating from Doaktown Consolidated High School in 1980. That fall, she began her post-secondary studies at St. Thomas University, where she earned both a Bachelor of Arts and a Bachelor of Education degrees. By early 1986, she had completed her degrees and, without skipping a beat, returned to her roots, beginning her teaching career at DCHS that same fall.

Driven by a deep passion to help students beyond the classroom, Barb pursued additional training to become a Guidance Counselor. She officially took on that role at DCHS in 1990, making an even greater impact on the lives of students.

In 1994, Barb married her Gary, and together they welcomed two sons—Erik in 1996 and Adam in 1998—bringing the same love and care she showed in her career to her family life. Her leadership journey continued in 2001 when she became Principal of Doaktown Primary School, while still serving as Guidance Counselor at DCHS. From 2004 to 2006, she split her time as Principal between both DCHS and DPS, showcasing her incredible dedication and work ethic.

With the opening of the new school in 2010, Barb transitioned to Central New Brunswick Academy as Vice-Principal. Just one year later, in 2011, she became the Principal of CNBA—a school that has grown under her guidance and care into the one we know and love today. Over the years, Barb has shaped the lives of thousands of students. While not every decision may have been easy or universally agreed upon, her intentions were always rooted in what was best for the students. She gave her heart to the community, not just as an educator but as a quiet and constant source of support.

We are beyond fortunate to have her in our lives—not just as a teacher and a principal, but as our aunt and guide. As she moves into a new chapter of her life, we can only hope it brings her the same joy, purpose, and adventure she has given to so many of us.

Words will never be enough, but from the bottom of our hearts: thank you, Barb.
