Happy Spring to everyone connecting to read our monthly Newsletter! It has been a very wet month so far but that sure goes a long way to protecting our forests and keeping the wells full, always the optimist!

This month I wanted to highlight the importance of our tourism industry that is beginning to take on a vitally needed injection of money for our Village. The New Brunswick trail has brought an entirely new demographic to the region, in all four seasons, via ATV's and snow machines. They stop in our municipality for gas, groceries, restaurants, and to check out anything interesting that is going on. The importance of having thriving local businesses to support people touring through the area is crucial. This summer marks significant anniversaries for three local sites and events. The Salmon and Fiddlehead Festival will be marking its 25th season of celebrating our community, the Train Bridge turns 100, and the Doak Historical property is celebrating 200 years! The Deputy Mayor, Dorinda Parker, has organized three sub committees to plan events for the entire long weekend in August. Each leg of this committee will be arranging events to celebrate all the milestones surrounding these anniversaries and then coordinating together for a fun - filled weekend. The importance of marketing this with our partners at the Greater Miramichi Service Commission, in our local newsletter, social media, and of course through you, the residents. Let's make Doaktown the summer destination for 2025!

The growing importance we are placing on tourism requires a location to spread the word and we are working on that. We believe the Doak Provincial Heritage Site is a critical component in growing tourism in the Village and surrounding area. Council has approached the Provincial government through a committee of engaged residents to become caretakers of the property. There has been a comprehensive Operation Plan developed and submitted to the Tourism Department. The Plan has received very positive feedback. If approved, this will allow the Doak Site to serve as the Tourism Hub for the region. There will be a kiosk operating at the facility which will direct visitors to the attractions in the area: serve as a rest area, develop trails to walk, snowshoe, ski, and a venue to tell the story of our Village.

On other business in the municipality, all documentation has been submitted to acquire funding for a new fire station, and we expect news on that in mid-June. There has been a committee of Council to plan and direct construction and this group has met with two engineering consultants to manage the project. This will be decided during the next committee meeting and that will be followed by detailed drawings before the tendering process begins. It is important for the community members to ask questions and understand how council and staff is working to minimize the impact on taxes. Have a wonderful and safe summer, and if you are looking for something to fill your spare time, reach out to any of the committees organizing this summer's big events and volunteer some time! We truly have the most beautiful community on the Chi!

What Is a Will and Why Should I Have One?

A Will deals with the distribution of a person's property upon their death. There are several reasons why a person (called a "testator") should have a Will. The first is that it allows the testator to choose how they would like their assets to be distributed. Second, it allows the testator to select the person (called the "executor") that they want to manage their estate and carry out their wishes after their death. Third, if the testator has children under the age of eighteen, a Will provides guardianship for those children. Lastly, if a person dies without a Will, called dying intestate, the family will need to apply to the Court to have an administrator appointed and the estate will be divided according to rules set out in legislation which may not divide the estate the way the person would have wanted. Having a Will avoids delays and costs that family members or the estate will need to absorb in carrying out this process.

How Do I Create a Will?

In preparing to create a Will, it is important to consider who will take on key roles. These roles include guardians of children under the age of eighteen and the executor. Being executor involves a lot of responsibility so you should make this selection carefully. The executor must keep detailed records of everything they do with your estate. They may also need to hire professionals, such as lawyers or accountants, depending on the complexity of your estate and whether they need to apply to the Court to obtain letters probate. You should also choose an alternate executor who will distribute your estate if the executor is unable or unwilling to act.

Next, it is important to consider who you want to receive part of your estate. These persons are called your beneficiaries. You can specifically list assets, like property, that you would like to go to named beneficiaries, or you may choose to leave the entirety of your estate to your spouse or to your children. You may also choose to leave all or a portion of your estate to charity. You can list specific personal assets as gifts or bequests. Any remaining property, called the residual estate, can also be identified and distributed according to the Will's instructions. The last step is to have the Will written. This can be done by the individual creating the Will themselves or with the assistance of a lawyer. It is recommended that individuals seek legal assistance to ensure that all documents are prepared and witnessed properly, especially if the individual owns a business, or has other aspects of their estate that may complicate the Will.

Why Seek Legal Assistance in Creating a Will?

There are many 'do-it-yourself' Will options on the market, allowing individuals to create their own Will. Here are four reasons why individuals should seek legal assistance when writing a Will:

First, a lawyer thinks beyond the Will itself. There are often complex legal issues that could have an impact on the ability for a Will to be carried out in the manner intended by the person. Lawyers have the expertise to recognize these issues and propose solutions and options.

Second, the lawyer will retain records regarding the creation of the Will which are valuable to the executor and any party seeking to uphold the validity of the Will if it is challenged. The lawyer could serve as an important witness. This will ensure that your wishes, as set out in your Will, are followed.

Third, lawyers have the expertise to monitor for, and protect against, undue influence. Undue influence happens when the testator is pressured into making a decision they would not otherwise make. Lawyers are required to adhere to strict practice standards and must ensure that any documents prepared are free from undue influence. Lastly, Will kits may result in a Will that is not valid in New Brunswick. Each Province has its own requirements for a valid Will. A general Will kit may not meet these requirements resulting in a Will that is invalid.

Given a lawyer's expertise in this area, seeking legal assistance in creating a Will enhances the validity of the document. 'Do-it-yourself' Will kits do not hold these safeguards.
